Cleared for takeoff! ...

Sometimes when I listen for God, I hear the strangest things. Several months ago, the session voted to search for a designated pastor for First Presbyterian. We have been hearing that finding a pastor might not be possible. There are few, if any, candidates graduating from our seminaries. We should look for several people with skills in differing parts of the ministry or share our people resources with other churches. So how does a designated pastor differ from a called pastor?

Briefly, in this way — After a pastoral search, if a candidate is "called", they become your pastor for an undetermined period of time. When a separation occurs, there is a period of recovery before beginning a new search. If a designated pastor is hired, that time period is stated, normally 3 years. In this three-year period both the congregation and the candidate work to see if this is a good fit for both. If it is a good fit, then a call may be offered. Like trying on shoes before you buy them.


Session Summary for July

Theological Endowment Fund Fulfilling Its Purpose

The Florence K. Hull Theological Education Fund was established to provide scholarships for students currently studying to enter the ministry. Individuals applying for a grant must be under care of a Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church (USA) as an Inquirer or Candidate for the Office of Minister and be enrolled in a theological seminary of the Presbyterian Church (USA). They then complete and submit a Florence K. Hull Theological Fund Grant Application.

Over many years we have awarded many scholarships including to our own Justin Warner. This year a scholarship award is being made to Theodore Longlois from Birmingham, Alabama, who will be beginning classes this fall at Princeton Theological Seminary. His goal is to become a chaplain. We are blessed by those who have created or given to the variety of endowments and special funds that we have because they wanted to make a difference in our lives.
