Roof leaks, garden maintenance, elevator issues, old windows, heat and air conditioning issues, new programs, and other needs creep up just as they do in our homes.

Thankfully, we have been blessed with a generous congregation that takes care of today while planning for the security of our faith home and its good works. These gifts, through Endowments, assure the facility, programs, worship, music, youth activities, fellowship activities, and more thrive into the future. Christian Education is offering a two-part adult education class on Poetry writing. These classes will take place on Thursday, October 19, and Thursday October 26, from 3 to 5 pm. October 19th's class will involve reading and discussing two Ohio writers, Keri Gunter Seymour and John Burrough. There will be a discussion of how they write and then a focus on Appalachia and Beat writing, with 1-2 writing activities based upon some of their poems.

October 26th's class will be a discussion and writing involving a memoir-to-poem "jump." Discussion will include what happens when using established text and "erasure" to make prose poetry.
